Assessment and attainment

It is important that we take time to assess the progress our students are making. As we conclude our recent assessment weeks, I must congratulate students for their approach to these assessments and thank teachers for their dedication to accurate assessment. Teachers are currently marking and moderating the exams papers to ensure the timely publication of results.

KS3 BASE Assessments

Students in years 7, 8 and 9 have completed assessments in all subjects and will receive results using the following criteria:

- **B Beginning to show**, where your child is beginning to demonstrate some of the criteria we expect at this stage of their learning.
- **A Approaching**, where your child is working towards the level we expect at this stage of their learning.
- S-Secure, where your child is at the level we expect at this stage in their learning.
- **E Exceeding**, where your child is above the level we expect at this stage in their learning.

Y11 Mocks

Mock exams are always an important part of GCSE preparation. It is essential students sit their mocks in a formal setting, under full exam conditions and experience something that is as close to the real thing as possible. This is an excellent opportunity to demonstrate the progress that they have made and to learn how they can improve further.

We know students worked tirelessly to prepare for these exams, with weekly attendance at period 6 sessions in core subjects and completing thorough revision at home. During the mock exam period our school values of ambition and dedication have been evident every day. Even the



interruption of the snow day didn't deter students! As we come to the end of the mock examination period, we must congratulate students on their efforts. Staff are already busily assessing papers, eager to know what students have done well and what will be the focus of support over the next few months.

At the end of December, we will be holding a mock exam result day to emulate the summer results day. We hope that this will be a positive experience for students and if not, students recognise what they need to do prior to actual exams in the summer. Results will also be sent home to parents.

Science

Please find below a summary of what students have studied in science lessons this past term:

Year 7 - After being introduced to fundamental lab skills, cell biology and the world of atoms and elements in their first term, Year 7 pupils have shifted their learning onto physics. They have been learning about energy, all the forms it takes, where we get our energy from and how you can calculate how much energy is used in a typical household. Later this term, they will go back to biology with lessons on movement with the opportunity of dissecting chicken wings to learn how joints work!

Year 8 - Year 8 pupils this term have begun investigating the digestive system in more detail, looking at what key nutrients we need to survive, how we can test for those nutrients and what key parts of our digestive system enables us to absorb them. Later this term they will return to looking at elements, atoms, and compounds, focusing on the periodic table and the properties of specific groups (1, 7, and 0).



Year 9 - This term, Year 9 students have advanced their knowledge in cell biology by looking at stem cells, their uses and the ethics behind their use. They will soon move onto looking at the periodic table in greater depth, how it was put together and, crucially, looking at group 1, 7 and 0 elements of the periodic table.

Year 10 - Since starting their learning for GCSEs in Year 9, Year 10 students are looking to finish off learning topics to do with paper 1 Biology, Chemistry and Physics. This will mean that they are half way through learning everything that they will need to know for their Year 11 exams. This term, the focus will be on electrolysis for chemistry, molecules and matter for physics and then looking at various non-communicable diseases for Biology. By the start of next term, they will be prepared for their first mini-mock of everything that they have been taught.

Year 11 - With mocks underway, this term has been dedicated to ensuring all year 11 students have the key concepts and knowledge required to do well in their exams. Once finished, they will return back to learning the last few remaining topics left for their GCSEs, mainly looking at how resources from water to metals are used and recycled.







Children in Need Fundraising

Thank you to everyone for rising to the challenge of walking 500 miles for Children in Need. It was great to see the whole school community come together, and all do their bit for this worthy cause from primary to secondary, staff and students. We lost track of how many laps were walked but it was way more than the 500 mile target. Some students even ran and clocked up 15 or 16 laps in their allocated session! Our Trust values were on show throughout the day with students showing dedication and ambition.

There was a great deal of generosity and kindness shown too as students supported each other, donated cakes for sale and donated lots of money for Children in Need which does so much for disadvantaged students across the UK. At first count we have raised £408.51, an incredible achievement for all involved!

Anti-Bullying and Odd Socks Day

Throughout Anti-bullying week students took part in activities to help support and raise awareness of the importance of keeping children safe. A highlight of the week was Odd Socks Day when students and staff demonstrated their support by wearing their weirdest and wackiest odd socks. This is to show it is ok to be different and to promote support for diversity.

Anti-Bullying Week is a special week to encourage everyone – children, teachers and parents – to take a stand against bullying all year round. The organisers of the annual event (The Anti-Bullying



Alliance) say they hope this year's theme – "Choose Respect" – will empower children to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes.

The Anti-Bullying Alliance has released new research that says more than 23% of school children are frequently bullied. A survey of almost 45,000 pupils in England (aged 4-18), showed that one in five experience frequent face-to-face bullying, with rates much higher for those with special educational needs or disabilities.

To combat this, this year was a call to action encouraging all to 'Choose Respect'. The anti-bullying alliance writes; 'From playgrounds to parliament, our homes to our phones, together we can bring an end to bullying, which negatively impacts millions of young lives. Imagine a world where respect and kindness thrives — it's not just a dream, it's in the choices we make'.



A reminder Unifrog, an online careers platform, is available for all students and parents to use, providing valuable careers advice and guidance.




Extra-Curricular




Attendance
